Community & Public Health

The backbone of our work

- ▶ **Mega Health Camp, Jalamangala** — 200+ people screened for anaemia, diabetes, hypertension, and cancers in a single day.
- ▶ **HPV vaccination** — 76 girls vaccinated at Mahatma School; awareness drives for cervical-cancer prevention.
- ▶ **Annadaanam** — grocery kits for visually-challenged families at Vishwabharathi Ashram.
- ▶ **Diabetes & NCDs** — World Diabetes Day walkathons and camps with partner clubs.



Women's & Maternal Health

A sustained club priority

- ▶ **Parent-craft** — pregnancy-wellness sessions for ~30 expecting couples, led by our doctor-members.
- ▶ **Menopause awareness** — "Jaagruti" and pan-district workshops in collaboration with medical societies.
- ▶ **Okkuta Mahila Habba** — "Happy Woman = Happy Family," a programme on women's health and well-being.
- ▶ **Led from within** — our members include practising gynaecologists and fetal-medicine specialists.



Adolescent Health & Education

Reaching the next generation

- ▶ **"Growing Up Right"** — adolescent-health booklets translated into Telugu, and planned in Bengali & Sinhala.
- ▶ **School programmes** — health talks, HPV awareness and life-skills sessions in schools.
- ▶ **Financial literacy** — money-management education for adolescents.
- ▶ **Labs & libraries** — school infrastructure projects in the pipeline.



Environment & Sustainability

Everyday action, public awareness

- ▶ **Tree plantation** — native fruit trees planted with schools for a greener campus.
- ▶ **"Half Dosa" campaign** — breakfast-spot outreach in Jayanagar promoting the 3 Rs and less plastic.
- ▶ **Bags, not plastic** — 500 paper & cloth bags distributed at the Kadalekayi Parishe.
- ▶ **Water conservation** — "Save Water" drives and the international Ghana Save-Water project.
